

OUR RPL PROCESS

STEP 1: Academia will first conduct a Pre-Qualification phone call with the prospective student to ensure the Qualification or Course is right for them; discuss their work history and experience; confirm they have an eligible Third Party References to verify their competency; and discuss the type of evidence they can supply that supports the requirements for RPL. Once approved, the prospective student is emailed enrolment information including the Academia Student Handbook.

STEP 2: Upon successful enrolment, the allocated Trainer & Assessor will be in contact to introduce themselves, provide an overview of the RPL process, schedule the RPL Assessment, and email the Student with information on how to prepare.

STEP 3: During the RPL Assessment the student will complete various documents within the Student RPL Toolkit with their Trainer & Assessor. The Assessor will ask the student a series of competency based questions to verify they meet all performance and knowledge criteria, and will assist the student in selecting elective units based on their goals and current skillset.

STEP 4: Third Party Reference/s are contacted by the Trainer & Assessor to complete Third Party Verification - at the same time they will finalise all documentation and evidence mapping. In the event additional evidence is required to meet RPL criteria, the Trainer & Assessor will reach out.

STEP 5: Upon concluding all elements of the RPL process, the students Qualification is issued! Hard copies sent via post with digital copies sent to the students email for safe keepings.

Recognition of Prior Learning (RPL) is an assessment-only process to assess and formally recognise an individual's existing knowledge, skills, and experience.

This allows individuals to gain formal qualifications without having to undergo traditional training for the skills and knowledge they have already acquired through previous education, employment background and history, on the job training and more.

The students skills, knowledge and experience is mapped against the criteria within each unit of competency of a Qualification to therefore grant competency.

RPL is supported with student evidence, third party reference verifications and competency conversations with the Trainer & Assessor.
